Puppy Vaccination Chart

DHPP/DHLPP

- Distemper: a highly contagious disease infecting the digestive, respiratory, and central nervous systems.
- Adenovirus (Hepatitis): severe viral infection of the liver (does not affect people).
- Leptospirosis: A severe bacterial infection which causes acute kidney and liver disease.
- Parainfluenza: The viral component of "kennel cough", a respiratory infection. Highly contagious.
- Parvovirus: a very contagious intestinal infection. It causes bloody diarrhea and may be fatal.

Bordetella: The bacterial component of "kennel cough" (tracheobronchitis). Highly contagious.

Rabies: Viral disease transmitted in saliva to open wounds or via bite wounds. Required by law for dogs over 16 weeks of age. Fatal to animals and humans.

Vaccinated Adults

Boosters: Rabies: Booster 1 year after initial vaccination, then every 3 years.

DHPP: Booster 1 Year after last puppy vaccination, then every 3 years.

Bordetella: Booster Yearly Leptospirosis: Booster yearly

Deworming: Control and prevent internal parasites with a monthly Sentinel tablet and annual

heartworm and fecal exam.

Fleas and Tapeworms: Control fleas and prevent tapeworms with Frontline, Revolution, or Comfortis.

For the safety of everyone's dogs and our staff, <u>ALL</u> boarding dogs must be current on DHPP, Bordetella, and Rabies vaccinations.
